High School Summer Credit Recovery

Parents/Guardians will receive communication from Teachers and/or School Counselors if students are required to participate in this pathway. Students currently in the 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade who did not pass one of their core academic classes will need to enroll in a credit recovery class during the 2023-2024 school year. Credit recovery classes are only available to students who must repeat the course. These classes are not an option for students taking the class for initial credit (i.e., first time or for a higher grade). Transportation will be provided for current HCPS students.

Summer Academy Graduation

Summer Academy is offered to high school students of Henrico County in order to provide educational opportunities for them to take credit courses they would not be able to schedule in the regular school program or to take such courses that may help them advance toward graduation.

Only eligible students from Henrico County Public Schools may participate in the Wednesday, July 31, 2024, Graduation Ceremony at Henrico High School at 10:00 a.m.

High School General Summer Academy Information

ATTENDANCE AND TARDY REQUIREMENTS:

Attendance during Summer Academy 2024 is very important. One day of summer academy is equal to approximately one week of regular school. Parents are asked not to make vacation plans which conflict with summer academy dates.

- Students who are absent in excess of three (3) days, EXCUSED OR UNEXCUSED, will be withdrawn from summer school for one-credit classes. Only one absence is allowed for semester classes, including driver education.
- Three tardies or three early dismissals will be counted as one absence, regardless of the amount of time involved. Any tardy after 10:30 a.m. or any early dismissal prior to 10:30 a.m. will be counted as a half-day absence.
- There can be NO EXCEPTIONS to this requirement, REGARDLESS OF THE REASONS. These attendance and tardy requirements are not meant to be punitive. All schools must maintain and enforce a minimum number of student hours per class in order to retain their accreditation.

MAKE-UP WORK:

- Make-up work applies ONLY to EXCUSED absences. Obviously, there is no opportunity to make up work beyond three (3) days because if a student misses more than 3 days, excused or unexcused, he/she is withdrawn. (See Attendance Requirements above.)
- In order to be able to make up work on any of the three days allowed, students
 must bring a valid note signed by a parent or guardian stating the reason for
 absence.

DISCIPLINE:

- Summer Academy 2024 is a privilege, not a requirement. There is much to be done in a compressed time frame and, therefore, little time for behavior problems.
- Students referred to the summer administrator for violations of discipline may be withdrawn from Summer Academy.
- Copies of the Summer Academy Discipline Regulations will be distributed on the first day of the summer session to be signed by both the student and a parent or guardian and returned to the school. Residents and non-residents will follow Henrico County Public Schools Code of Student Conduct.

REFUND PROVISIONS:

- No refunds for Henrico County summer courses will be given after June 13, 2024.
- Henrico County Public Schools reserves the right to cancel classes for which there is insufficient enrollment. Refunds will be given for courses which are not offered due to insufficient enrollment.
- When a class reaches its maximum enrollment, registrations will be returned in reverse date order.
- No refunds will be authorized for students withdrawn for disciplinary reasons or excessive absences.

FOOD SERVICE:

Breakfast and lunch may be provided free of charge through the USDA's Summer Food Service Program depending on a site's eligibility status. Eligibility can vary, so please check with a Summer Academy coordinator at the site to verify. Students may also have the option to bring in their own snacks.

Courses for Rising 9th-12th Graders

(0.5 credits)

Automotive Technology introduces students to the many fields related to the automotive service industry, including engine and brake repair.

Baking and Pastry teaches students safety and sanitary practices in a commercial kitchen. Students will focus on breadmaking, cupcake baking/decorating, and making various types of cookies.

Barbering teaches students the basics of hair, scalp, and skincare. Students practice on mannequins to hone their new skills and discover what it takes to operate a barbershop.

Computer-Aided Drafting is an introductory course where students gain an understanding of how to create drawings and 3D models using the latest CAD software.

Cosmetology teaches students the foundation of professional hair, skin, and nail care. Students will practice techniques needed to perform these services in a salon environment.

Criminal Justice explores the world of modern law enforcement. Learn to use police equipment to solve crimes and keep order. Topics include crime scene investigation, using police tactical gear, fingerprinting, and common patrol tactics.

Culinary Arts students participate in creative activities related to following recipes and cooking. Learn basic culinary techniques, menu planning, and explore culinary careers.

ESL Summer Academy and ESL Summer Enrichment will be offered to select rising 1st – 12th grade students. Extended-day <u>ESL Newcomer Summer Academy</u>, open for newcomer level 1 English learning students, will take place for five weeks with a focus on developing English language skills and academic vocabulary in the areas of speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Students will also be provided opportunities to engage with language through music, art, STEM, physical activity, and social-emotional learning. <u>ESL Summer Enrichment</u> will be offered for four hours per day for four weeks with a focus on building language and academic skills. It is intended for level 1-2 English learners who have been in US schools for less than three years. Registration forms will be sent home to those who qualify through their ESL teacher. English learning students who do not qualify for ESL Summer Enrichment may attend the summer academy for their home school.

Current students participating in the Dual Language Immersion program at Holladay Elementary are eligible to attend a half-day program to continue practicing both their English and Spanish language acquisition skills.
